I will submit an entry to a juried show. In doing this, you will learn the importance of following the instructions in the prospectus, to take and size digital images and to complete entry forms. There are instructions on the APS website to help you. Like many of us, you may not be accepted into the first show you try. This is not a failure but a disappointing way to learn that jurors make selections based on personal criteria and that lots of quality work gets passed over. In general, the competition is somewhat more gentle in our APS juried Member Shows than in the Statewide Show (members of the three NC pastel societies) or in our APS juried National Shows.

I will learn some new skills. Sign up for afternoon workshops taught by the APS meeting demonstrators, borrow books and DVD's from the APS library, sign up for the multi-day workshop being offered by Elizabeth Mowry in connection with the Statewide Pastel Show, look for other area opportunities!

I will ask for guidance and assistance. Let the Board know what would be helpful to you in achieving your goals. It is OUR GOAL to help you meet yours!

I am looking forward to personally wishing you a Happy New Year and to learning what we can do to help you on our artistic journey. In the meantime, keep those fingers dusty! **Sparky**



DIRECTIONS TO APS MEETINGS AT GRACE COMMUNITY CHURCH


495 Cardinal Road, Mills River, NC 28759

***Painting the Landscape in Pastel* by Albert Handell and Anita Louise West**

Known for his use of luminous color, Albert Handell, whose lush landscapes light up these pages, provides lucid instructions to help first-time pastelists achieve impressive results as soon as they begin working with the medium.

After reviewing pastel supplies, the author discusses landscape composition and how to establish large shapes first, abstract certain areas, develop a focal point, work from dark to light, and capture the illusion of reality through color. Stepped demonstrations isolate specific landscape aspects, showing how the pastelists depicts skies, trees, buildings, water, rocks, woods, snow and light.

“Something has to shift. Maybe it’s a shift from left brain to right brain; but that shift seems absolutely necessary to create consistently strong compositions. Until that shift is made and you start thinking in abstract masses on a picture plane, you are, in a sense, on the outside of the painting process looking in.”



When: Wednesday & Thursday. – Jan. 13th & 14th from 9-4


Cost: \$175 for the two full days
