

Letter from the President Suzanne "Sparky" Nelson



When the going gets tough, the tough go shopping workshopping, that is! Just as a new sweater or golf club or "app" can do wonders for your appearance or performance or efficiency, a workshop can bring a fresh perspective or technique or tool to your artistic efforts.

Workshops are a bit like immersion language programs. While you are there, your whole focus is on your art, distractions are minimal, and your effort is intense. A highly skilled instructor works with you at your easel, providing guidance, inspiration, and critique. Really, how could you *not* benefit from such an experience?

I have learned that workshops are best approached with a "what the heck" attitude. Be prepared to struggle, to experiment, to be awed by the instructor's work and disappointed in your own. Plan to learn more from your failures than your successes. I have been surprised, when weeks or months after a workshop, a concept that baffled me will suddenly make sense and put a new spark in my work!

Of course, there are many types of workshops. They range from half-day sessions like APS offers as part of our programming, to multi-day experiences in a place away from home, to those where you travel much farther to paint in Provence or Tuscany or even China! Renowned instructors advertise their workshop schedules in the major art magazines and on their websites. The Pastel Journal publishes a list, by Instructor, near the back of each issue. Similarly, The Artist's Magazine publishes a listing by state at the back of each edition and on-line at http://media2.fwpublications.com/NLS/2016 March Workshops The Artists Magazine.pdf.

As I write this, there are still a few spaces available in the Elizabeth Mowry workshop that APS is hosting in conjunction with the Statewide Pastel Show. Elizabeth is an incredible artist and a wonderful instructor. She lives in Colorado and rarely travels this far to teach. This is a wonderful workshop opportunity – and right in our (Black Mountain) back yard!

So, how about it? Could your work use a tweak or push? Has the going been tough? Then you need to go workshopping! Whatever you do, keep those fingers dusty! **Sparky**

P.S. In my last letter, I urged you to consider entering you work in Exhibitions. Well, now you have no excuses! There is a complete menu of possibilities for you – the non-juried show at the Grace church (see the description and instructions in this newsletter), the Statewide Pastel Show which we are hosting this year (see the description and instructions in this newsletter), and the Juried Member show which will be held in October (descriptions and instructions will come soon.)

Ron Laboray will discuss aspects of jurying public exhibitions. Attendees are encouraged to ask questions about curating, submitting to exhibitions and how to approach a studio practice and strengthen an artistic statement.

He was the Judge of the APS 2015 Juried Member Exhibition at the Black Mountain Center for the



The work of Ron Laboray has been exhibited in museums, special project spaces, and galleries in cities such as New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Memphis, St. Louis, Taiwan, and Japan. Laboray's art merges abstract painting and drawing with a pseudoscientific method to create a growing visual archive of popular culture. In his work, the visual language of abstraction supports a color-coded archive of data, based on mass culture elements like television, movies, comic books, fast food logos and junk mail advertising. Ron currently resides in Asheville North Carolina and holds the rank of Assistant Professor of Painting and Drawing at Western Carolina University.

Artists of influence are many but clearly among my favorites are Degas, Sorolla, Mary Cassatt, Sargent and Twachtman.

After an itinerant lifetime because of my husband's employment, I have been "at home and studio" in Hendersonville North Carolina for little over a year. I love it here in WNC. I am happy to serve as Appalachian Pastel Society Program Chair.

Pastels have been almost my exclusive medium of late and feel that I've "come home" with them. Subjects of interest to me are many especially the landscape and figures, but really it matters more *that* I paint rather than *what* I paint. Process is where I find peace as well as exhilaration.

Artist Statement: I am just fascinated with the colors, moods and sounds of my immediate environment. The ordinary, quiet moments of daily living are often filled with common things that I find quite lovely. Raising this

simple and abundant life to the sacred, which is evident to me, is what my painting is "about". I want the viewer to breathe a sigh of joy or relief when viewing my work or living with it. I believe that this fast and often violent world needs more of the beautiful and this is what I offer: my sense of wonder at the beauty in each day that I live. I want to share the things that delight me. It is that simple.







Submit name, title, medium and outside dimensions (height x width) via email on or before March 13. A brief artist's statement to be displayed next to a painting is optional. Each artist may enter up to two paintings, space permitting. Identify paintings as Painting A and B to indicate the artist's priority for hanging. Submit all entry information to annekallen@gmail.com by Sunday, March 13. Digital image(s) to be considered for publicity purposes are being accepted now.

Deliver your paintings to Grace Community Church on Monday, March 21, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

A \$10 entry fee per artist is due on March 21 when paintings are delivered. All artwork must be properly framed and wired for hanging. A signed *Notice of Liability Disclaimer* will accompany each entry. Artists will find a copy of the disclaimer and a label for the back of their painting at www.appalachianpastelsociety.org From the home page, follow the link to "Exhibitions" to locate, review and print the disclaimer. At the same site, review *Roles and Responsibilities for Non-Juried Shows*.

A notebook of artist biographies will be available for gallery patrons during the show.

Exhibiting artists are encouraged to update information and/or submit a biography on March 21 when paintings are delivered.

The Gallery will be open Monday through Thursday, 9-5; Friday, 9-1; Sunday 8-12. Closed Saturday. Pick-up Date: Saturday, May 14, noon to 4 pm at the Grace Community Church.

All paintings will hang for the duration of the show, including any paintings sold during the show. If a painting is sold, the Church will refer the buyer to the artist. If the artist negotiates a sale, the Church requests a 10% donation.


