

# Artist of the Month — Anne Allen

### Nature As Teacher

Pastel painter, Anne Allen, was born in Detroit, Michigan, and raised in the woodlands of Bloomfield Township. Her childhood home was filled with classical music and art. In addition to being an avid gardener, her mother sang with the Michigan Opera Theater. Art, nature and music were, and continue to be, Anne's earliest teachers.

A high point in Anne's professional career was being recruited to serve on the opening team of a new performing arts center in Naples, Fl. The Philharmonic Center for the Arts was the home of a resident symphony orchestra, world-class entertainers, sculpture gardens, and four art galleries. She served on the executive team for 10 years, guiding the center's media communications division.

Western North Carolina became her new home in 2011. Anne became a member of the River Arts District and was drawn to paint in the outdoors in different locales. She made three trips to Ghost Ranch in Abiquiu, NM, where skies and towering rock formations became images for early work. Now painting in North Carolina, her gardens inspire music-like paintings of roses, poppies, trees and recently, Japanese iris.

Anne serves on the board of the Appalachian Pastel Society, an arts organization of 103 members. She is the society's librarian and chair of non-juried shows.

The opening reception and presentation of awards will be Saturday, October 21 from 5:00 to 7:00 pm. at the Jailhouse Gallery, 115 E. Meeting St., Morganton, NC 28655. We are delighted to have the Burke Arts Council co-hosting this event (www.burkearts.org). Dawn Emerson, show juror, will be joining us for the reception. We hope you will be able to attend. If not, we encourage you to view the show. Gallery hours are Monday through Friday 10 am – 4 pm, Saturday, 10 am – 3 pm. The Show closes November 17, 2017.

Dawn Emerson will also conduct a live painting demonstration from noon until 3 pm on the day of the reception. The demo will be at the historic Burke County Courthouse, which is next door to the Jailhouse Gallery in Morganton. Dawn is an energetic artist, who paints with bold, dance-like gestures. Her approach is intuitive and experimental, and she often paints very different interpretations of the same subject. # You Know You're a Pastelist if...

You know you are a Pastelist if:

- ♦ If you have a hissy fit if someone asks if you are painting with chalk.
- → If you get way more excited getting a new box of pastels than a box of chocolates.
- → If when you blow on anything, being birthday candles or a sweet dandelion, you get very excited because it reminds you of blowing on your pastel painting.
- ♦ If the word smudge brings feelings of nervousness that a previous pastel teacher will smack you.
- → If you definitely can't buy just one pastel stick.
- → If pastel dust becomes a way of life, and dirty fingernails are a sign that you're being creative.
- → If you really don't understand why watercolorists are so concerned about white negative space.
- ♦ If you cringe when other artists use too much white or too much black.
- ♦ If being a spontaneous artist who paints at a moment's notice makes you love pastel.
- → If you would rather have your grandchild run out in a busy street than purposely try to touch a finished pastel.
- → If you burst into tears because one soft, expensive pastel stick, falls out of your hand onto a hard floor, and disintegrates into 100 pieces.
- → If you try to defend why pastels should be bought over oil paintings after you just spent \$300 framing a piece because everything we do has to be under glass.
- ♦ If for all the reasons above you still choose pastel as your favorite medium to paint with.

**Suzy Hart** will be presenting a paper, "The Figure as Communicator," in November at the FACE/TRAC 2017 Conference in Miami. The following is an excerpt from the abstract of Suzy's presentation:

"The human figure and face provide a powerful means to communicate emotion, expression, and narrative. It is means for psychological exploration, release, allegory and social comment. The canon of this century will certainly include the fascinating new approaches in figurative art as well as the new realism as it assigns historical importance. Realists should be taking an active part in this discussion to define this movement. Artists have a critical role in shaping the way people think about the urgent challenges posed by a cybernetic, pluralistic, environmentally, and martially challenged world...What do we realists have to say, we who use the marvelous human figure as muse? Will we follow the linear path of western art history, struggling to find placement within a narrowly defined classical aesthetic that is based solely on technical purity and a strong dose of nostalgia? Will we remain ensnared in 20th Century imperatives of shamanism and novelty supported by incoherent language? Or will we open expand our thinking to include a variety of approaches and full liberation from obfuscation? Will we acknowledge and defend valid aesthetic, formal and intellectual criteria for assigning the name "Art" to objects?

The figure represents our humanity. Most rewarding of all subjects, it can help us shape the new canon and redefine aesthetics and art. Rendered with skill, poetry and intellectual integrity, the figure can elevate more than the dialogue about art and the artist's place in the world, it elevates the mind and spirit." 




