

Letter from the President—Gary Rupp

Still another painter has well said "Artists deepen our sense of wonder because they have retained the ability to see life with a delighted eye."

All of these contemplations inspire me and get close to giving words to what I feel when I paint. In the end, however, I like the response of an artist who was asked how he liked his hobby of painting. He replied "I don't paint to fill the time, I paint to redeem it." Whatever reason you find to paint in 2018, I hope you will find APS to be a place that supports and encourages you in this journey!

Artist of the Month — Alec Hall

Animals, both domestic and wild, have always been a major force and focus in my life. For as long as I can remember, I have had a special, unexplainable connection with animals that would draw me to them regardless of where I was or what I was doing. Because of this connection, I became a veterinarian and enjoyed a



career working with animals for 32 years. In 2003, I retired from my veterinary career and embarked on my new profession as an animal artist.




My art education started by taking an evening class in oil painting when I was 46 years old and still working full time as a veterinary pathologist for a pharmaceutical company in Kalamazoo, MI. My interest in art soon became a passion that was too strong to ignore and I continued to pursue it with additional evening classes & workshops in various media. I also apprenticed with a local Michigan artist two nights a week for 3 years. After I retired from my "veterinary day job", I was hired to be the pastel instructor at the Kalamazoo Institute of Art and kept that position for 8 years.

In 2014, my wife and I, along with two house cats, made the move to Hendersonville, NC. We are very happy with that decision not only because of the milder climate, but also because of the vibrant arts community that we have found here. I am currently a member of the Appalachian Pastel Society, the Great Lakes Pastel Society, the Art League of Henderson County, the Arts Council of Henderson County, the Western North Carolina Woodcarvers, and the Apple Country Woodcrafters. In 2016, I served as Vice President of APS, and in 2017, I became the Treasurer of APS.

Artist of the Month — Alec Hall

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Over the years, I have been fortunate to have my artwork juried into many local and national shows and I have been honored to win a number of awards. My work has also been recognized in the Pastel 100 Exhibition in the Pastel Journal and in the on-line juried show sponsored by UART. My artistic career has included 10 one-person shows at various venues in Michigan and North Carolina.

I believe that all artists are in pursuit of their own personal truth and that their art is a reflection of this pursuit. Because of my life's work with animals, I am most passionate about my art when I am painting the animals that continue to inspire me. In order to be faithful to my own personal truth, I have chosen to represent each animal in a realistic style. It is my hope that when you look at my paintings, you will see the beauty and grace, and sense the strength and character, of every animal that I portray.

National Show—Dawn Emerson Demo

Dawn Emerson not only shows her great painting skills and techniques along with a unique flair for demonstration. She plays "Cirque de Soleil" music and melds the sound with movement while applying her paint strokes. Dawn painted and finished two large paintings from photos she had taken of bisons. She did a minimal sketch then using a rubber brayer applied some dark ink strokes for the underpainting. Using both Pan Pastels and soft pastels she created an abstract like painting with just enough of the image to let you see what it was without telling the whole story. She left lots is white space around the edges of each painting to create a visual frame. Such a dynamic artist!! It was a fast three hours.











National Show—Dawn Emerson Workshop

Dawn works in mixed media with pastel, but with an almost dance like movement with the painting. The general consensus is that the workshop was wonderful and that she is a fabulous teacher. 


Suzy Hart's Figure Drawing workshop has been moved up to Feb. 3-4, please call Suzy for more information at 845-986-3653
