Letter from the President—Gary Rupp

Happy are the painters, for they shall not be lonely. Light and colour, peace and hope, will keep them company to the end of the day. — Winston Churchill

This quote comes from Churchill's book "Painting as a Pastime," first published in 1950. Curious as to what a former world leader had to say on painting, I was surprised to find how much delight and solace he found in his oil painting. He wrote, "painting came to my rescue in a most trying time, and I shall venture in the pages to follow to express the gratitude I feel." It is no secret that Churchill suffered from what he called "black dog depression", but I had not read before that painting was a significant remedy for him. He goes on to write that painters are capable bringing an exuberant enjoyment of life to their viewers which he calls *joie de vivre*. In his book, he clearly describes not only this joy in the finished painting, but in the process as well. "Just to paint is great fun. The colours are lovely to look at and delicious to squeeze out." He reminds me of the first time I opened a new box of pastels and the delight it was to my eyes.

Churchill did not start painting until he was forty years old and speaks of how much he had not seen or noticed until he became a painter. He says "I found myself instinctively as I walked noting the tint and character of a leaf, the dreamy, purple shades of mountains, the exquisite lacery of winter branches, the dim, pale silhouettes of far horizons." He wisely calls this awakening one of the chief delights of trying to paint. I, too, believe it is one of the best gifts we receive in doing a painting. He further argues that "painting is a companion with whom one may hope to walk a great part of life's journey." He makes the case that painting does not exhaust the body or fatigue the mind as do so many other activities which we are available to us.

This is clearly not a "how to" book on painting. His goal, in his own words, is "I do not presume to explain how to paint, but only how to get enjoyment." And to that end, I found the book to be thoughtful and inspiring. He does digress at points into becoming an instructor, but for the most part he is simply sharing how much delight he has found in painting. In the end, I think he would say to all of us, may you find *joie de vivre* in your painting!

I have been drawing or painting as long as I can remember and consciously thought of myself as artist, at age 13. Born in Manhattan and raised in Brooklyn, NY, my first art museum visit was at the Cloisters, part of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The next time artwork made an indelible mark was when I was sixteen, and had an "aesthetic" experience sitting before Picasso's Guernica. I was indeed lucky to have been exposed and introduced to much of the world's finest art being raised in that city.

Pastels are almost my exclusive medium of late and feel that I've "come home" with them. It is with my pastels that I compete with other past painters. I love to draw and they make that part of my art making exciting. It is with them that I explore the environment en plein air, try out new effects and ideas in the studio. Their brilliance and immediacy are the attraction for me. I am somewhat of an impatient painter!

I also have a love of abstract art that I nurture through the use of cold wax with my oil paints. Subjects of interest to me are many especially landscapes, but "really it matters more *that* I paint rather than *what* I paint."

Process is where I find peace as well as exhilaration.


