

Letter from the President—Gary Rupp

Browsing recently in an arts and crafts store, I came across a quote by John Ruskin, who was the leading English art critic of the Victorian era. He wrote "the entire object of *true education* is to make people not merely to do the right things, but enjoy them..." This reminded me of how I was first introduced to pastels. I was visiting an art festival where each artist was set up in a working studio so visitors could see their art and watch how they painted. I came across a pastelist who was clearly immersed in his painting and you could feel his enthusiasm. He graciously answered my questions concerning his art and was soon sharing with me how he had taken a pastel workshop, returned home, retired from his job and began painting full time. He then told me how to get started using pastels, including pastel brands and what surfaces were then available. From his advice, I went home and began to become intimately acquainted with pastels.

Thinking back I realize he had educated me about pastels in the truest sense. To paraphrase Ruskin, this artist showed me not just how to do it, but how to enjoy it! Even today, I remain grateful for that so called "chance meeting" with the pastelist who painted with skill and joy and set me on a course I have not regretted. And this, in a nutshell, is my hope for what we do at APS. Not only to introduce artists to this particular medium, but to increase their enjoyment of painting. Please come join us in learning new skills and find more joy in the art of pastels.

Tips from our Members

Thank you to Alison Webb for sharing these valuable tips!

Tips I have learned from attending APS meetings....

- ♦ To keep an Inventory of my work, with images, listing pricing, location, framing costs, etc.
- ♦ I am using "Airtable.com" on which all details are noted, and allows me to give access to others.
- ◆ To create my own pastel surfaces, using Golden's pastel ground, to which I added Burnt Sienna acrylic paint.
- To read all the email that are generated—full of useful info!

Artist of the Month—Pam Winkler

After retiring from a career as an architect in 2008, I decided to take two years exploring various art forms and media in hope of finding a new passion. I explored ceramics, stone carving and drawing before falling for pastel painting during a class at AB Tech. I have been working in pastels since 2010 and currently paint in my studio at Warehouse Studios, 170 Lyman Street in the River Arts District, Asheville, NC.

I enjoy exploring the form and texture of both shiny new and aging objects, often coming in for a close up view. As these manmade items age and wear they become more interesting with increased textures and colors, while still revealing something of their past. These old everyday functional objects often reveal the dedication to craft and beauty of their makers not often seen in today's mass production. My work starts with a photograph. I always have a camera on hand to capture unexpected objects and compositions. I crop the image on the computer to discover the most interesting and dramatic arrangement and look for sculptural forms to highlight. I exaggerate the lighting and contrast to bring depth to the objects and a theatrical sense often at odds with their common nature.

I use a variety of sanded papers depending on whether I am painting something rusting or peeling, or a shiny reflection in chrome. I work with both additive and subtractive processes,



putting down multiple layers of colors, and then using a paper towel or stiff brush to remove some of the layers. I am always trying new ways to express various textures. I like to blend several layers of colors when painting chrome, or lay down rough unblended strokes when portraying rust. I love to search for new subjects and textures to challenge myself and continue growing in my art.




Don Osterberg's pastel painting *Ballooning the Adirondacks* was juried into the Adirondack Art Show this year.


