Letter from the President— Will Evans

Dear Members and Friends of APS

An excellent article by Walter Isaacson appeared in The Saturday Evening Post a few years ago, titled "Learning from Leonardo". Isaacson authored a number of excellent best sellers, including the biography of Leonard Da Vinci. History tells us that Leonardo (April 15, 1452-May 2, 1519) was a genius. Truth is that he was as unlikely as any to be so. Born a bastard in the little town of Vinci, outside of Florence, he was prevented from following his fathers profession and thereby luckily avoided being an accountant. Surviving the plague and political strife of the warring Italian city-states, he was enrolled in an atelier of a Florentine painter.



He was fortunate to be surrounded by the best artists and sculptors of the budding Renaissance, learning alongside all of them: Masaccio whose groundbreaking work explored perspective, a concept drastically different from the stiff art of the Gothic period, Michangelo, Ghiberti, Alberti, Fillippo Lippi, Botticelli, and Raphael were among his peers. Da Vinci was, admittedly, a genius with interests in science, warfare, mathematics, and architecture. How, you may ask, does this speak to me? As summarized in Isaacson's article, my takeaway is that Da Vinci, with little formal training, was curious. He was interested in everything, and he honed his observation skills. He created for himself in many ways - by writing and illustrating massive volumes that were never published and by collaborating with like-minded individuals (a shameless plug for APS!). He learned from everyone and everything. It's said that he only finished 14 paintings in his 67 years. Even if you haven't finished your Mona Lisa, be comforted by that the fact that neither did he, carrying it around, making changes, to the day he died.

Have your own Da Vinci moment, and create your own Renaissance. Make your art to please yourself*. Stretch your horizons. Be curious. Be aware that your next piece could be *your* masterpiece!





Just recently I was able to attend the National Gallery's Pastel Exhibition and came face to face with this quote written large on the gallery wall:

"For its beauty, vivacity, freshness, and lightness of palette, pastel painting is more beautiful than any other kind of painting"

- Jean-Etienne Leotard, 1762

I have been working in pastels now for fifteen years and I found myself agreeing with this statement in spite of the fact I was in a museum with some of the most famous oil painters and sculptors in history. I can't say for certain when my love of pastels first took hold of me. One of the first workshops I attended was led by Maggie Price and as a participant we all received a large set of Unison pastels. I was immediately struck with the beauty of that set, so I was deeply annoyed when Maggie said unwrap each stick and then break them. Little did I know then how many times I would come to a place in my art where I had to make a hard decision in order to keep growing and nurturing my work.

As a student at Wheaton College I had received a minor in Studio Art and had been taught plein air painting. But after college I put aside my art and did not return to it for many years. When I did come back I went directly to pastels and have enjoyed painting with them ever since. I feel I have been very fortunate to have studied with Michael Chesley Johnson, Doug Dawson, Albert Handell, Terri Ford and others. At one point someone asked my sons, "What does your Dad do?" They replied, "He takes pastel workshops." Those workshops taught me about techniques, materials, and most important, how to be an artist. Every workshop taught me something, even if it was a style or technique I knew I didn't want to use again.

And in time, as I began to teach pastels and give workshops, I discovered I truly learned from my students in ways sometimes difficult to explain. I do know their questions helped me clarify my own process and articulate some of the reasons behind the choices I was making in my paintings. I am grateful for them and they continue to stretch me in every class. Some of my favorite paintings have come out of class demonstrations.



Imaginative Kids: Sawyer Bear Whitemiller

Nurturing "Wonder" in Children through the Creative Arts by Anne Allen

"Vivid, dreamy, detailed, swirly motions, and sad people" are the words Sawyer Bear Whitemiller wrote in his journal to describe the paintings of Dutch master, Vincent van Gogh (1853-1890).

Sawyer recently completed a four-week lesson, *Vincent van Gogh Skies*, prepared by Anne Allen, Appalachian Pastel Society board member and Sawyer's art teacher. Our studies blend moments of biography, art history, music, field trips and beginning pastel.


Sawyer is an inquisitive ten-year-old homeschooled student. It's as if you can touch his joy when he approaches a new experience. He absorbs his environment and information like a sponge".

Sawyer's exploration in the expressive arts include piano studies since age 4, visual arts education since age 6, and participation in ballet, jazz, hip hop, and tap lessons for several years. He is a member of the Lee County Alliance for the Arts in Southwest Florida and is an experienced competition gymnast.

Beyond the practice of art-making, Sawyer is included in budgeting for his art supplies, keeping a written inventory of paper, and assembling and caring for a new H-frame easel with his Dad. Following weekly prompts, he independently sets up his drawing board and supplies for each assignment. He completes one assignment per week, writes in a journal, and actively participates in one FaceTime meeting per month. His parents, Michelle and Brian, are dedicated to help implement each assignment as part of Sawyer's homeschool curriculum. They share mutual commitment to homeschooling a creative child.

Imaginative Kids: Sawyer Bear Whitemiller

A LESSON from "VAN GOGH SKIES"



The Starry Night (1889), an expressive night sky over a small hillside village, is one of Vincent van Gogh's most celebrated works. The painting has been in the permanent collection of the Museum of Modern Art, New York City, since 1941.

Pencil Study after Vincent van Gogh (2020) by Sawyer Bear. After an introductory lesson in art history and a slide show of van Gogh paintings, Sawyer observed a pencil study for van Gogh's The Starry Night. His assignment was to make a copy of the pencil study in his sketchbook.






Swirly Night (2020) by Sawyer Bear. Before starting his next painting, Sawyer was coached to select a palette of pastels. He made value strips of light/medium/dark blue pastel and light/medium/dark yellow pastel. Sawyer learned about opposites in mark-making: thick/thin, light/dark, squiggly/straight. After a side-by-side wet underpainting demonstration, Sawyer made a wet underpainting and his own interpretation of van Gogh's painting, The Starry Night. This is Sawyer's 4th pastel painting.

Imaginative Kids: Sawyer Bear Whitemiller

Drawing on her previous education in child development and the expressive arts, Anne sees herself coming full circle. "I designed a developmental music and visual arts program for young children when I was a graduate student at Antioch College, OH. The program was implemented and funded in a developmental day school in Florida and in other settings. The children were my teachers, always making me stretch. The study of creativity in children and adults is close to my heart."

Wheat Fields with Cypresses After spending time outdoors looking at the sky on a cloudy day, Sawyer was assigned to make his own painting of a sky with clouds. 


Note from the Editor:


