A tricky day with shifting light and mist but after a week of rain, finally some sun.


U ART 400, mix of hard and soft pastels.

I found it quite challenging with the angles of the roof, but she was happy with it and that's what counts!!


I used Rembrandt soft pastels and sanded pastel paper.
