Morning Presentation: 10am-12 noon

Walter will begin speaking at 10am after APS business is quickly reviewed. Open to everyone at no charge!

Afternoon Workshop: 1-4pm \$45 for members/\$55for non-members

When Walter set out to learn pastel, he wanted to concentrate on the medium without

worrying about the drawing part, which he already knew. He wanted to develop a rich, smooth look that was flexible and forgiving and he did this by painting creatures and all kinds of imaginative stuff. This pastel workshop will be much the same. We will concentrate on creating smooth, colorful surfaces using your imagination as subjects.

Walter will bring a supply of Rives BFK paper to be purchased. As a matter of information, Walter uses Rembrandt pastels with a few NuPastels and Sennelier pastels thrown in for good measure.

How to Register for Walter's Workshop:

You do not have to be a pastel artist to enjoy this workshop but you will have to bring pastels, a good basic set of NuPastels will do.

Meet the Artist of the Month - Miriam M. Hughes



Six years ago, new to pastels, Miriam Hughes spent most of her artistic life as a medical and scientific illustrator working for academia, then freelancing and finally in the pharmaceutical industry. Using pen and ink, watercolors and eventually computers, Miriam decided to try a new medium. Being unfamiliar

with pastels and uncertain about her ability to draw anything that wasn't either dead, a minute organism or a diagrammatic representation, she decided to take a pastel course at the Torpedo Factory in Alexandria, VA. It was far enough away from Pennsylvania that Miriam felt if she was awful at it, no one would know!

Dogs, being a passion for Miriam, were a subject she wanted to try and her first pastel drawing ever was of her beloved dog Spunky. It is still among her favorite drawings.

While working in dog related businesses, Miriam started doing portraits of her clients dogs and began taking other pastel classes at the Wayne Art Center in Wayne, PA. One of her favorite instructors encouraged Miriam to broaden her horizons and do more than just dogs, so landscapes entered her arena of subjects.

Working primarily with Canson and Prismacolor stick pastels, the dog portrait business thrived and while some of her earlier work still makes Miriam cringe, she felt she had found her passion. Going from an object focused drawing, like dogs, Miriam pursued landscapes – all of where she hiked with her dogs. Landscapes are still an area





of growthand potential with exciting opportunities to learn from other artists.

Several years ago, with the introduction of Pan Pastels, Miriam added them to her palette and found it gave a new softness to her canine work. "The only real danger", says Ms. Hughes, with Pan Pastels', "is going too far and my work could look like Elvis on Velvet! When I give presentations on the medium of combining pan pastels and stick pastels, I let the participants work on a drawing together. It helps them get the feeling of the pastels, and work through the danger of the "velvety look syndrome".

Originally from Chicago, Illinois, passing through Kansas for five years, spending a few decades in the Philadelphia area, Miriam now resides in Hendersonville, NC. Her work can be seen at Art Mob Studios' and Marketplace in Hendersonville; Wag, An Unique Pet Boutique, also in Hendersonville; on line at www. miriamhughes.com or on her Facebook Page Miriam M. Hughes or Miriam Hughes Canine Artist. Ms. Hughes, a member of The Canine Artist Guild, sells her work and does commissions both nationally and internationally and has a loyal following of dog loving art collectors.


