


Title: "Readers"




"Books On Art"


"Book Sale"




Greetings,

It's blocked in with dark nupastels, washed with Alcohol to kill the beige paper, then drawn with a variety of Terri Ludwig pastels.



Title: Pondering


Size 4.5 x 4.5"




